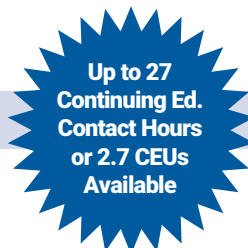

Helping Anyone Change, *Treating Explosive Kids: The Collaborative Problem Solving Approach*, and *The School Discipline Fix*.

Dr. Ablon received his doctorate in clinical psychology from the University of California at Berkeley and completed his training at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard Medical School. A dynamic and engaging speaker, Dr. Ablon was ranked #5 on the list of the world's top rated keynote speakers in the academic arena.

Dr. Ablon trains parents, educators and clinicians, and helps organizations throughout the world implement the Collaborative Problem Solving approach.

Jim Sporleder has dedicated the next chapter of his life to helping schools be more trauma-informed and become centers of healing. His travels as consultant, keynote speaker and trainer have taken him all over the United States.

Under Jim's leadership, Lincoln High School in Walla Walla, Washington, became a "Trauma-Informed School," gaining national attention due to a dramatic drop in out-of-school suspensions, increased graduation rates and the number of students going on to post-secondary education. These pioneering changes at Lincoln caught the attention of Jamie Redford, who spent a year filming the documentary, *Paper Tigers*, which tells the Lincoln story. The documentary was released at the May 2015 Seattle International Film Festival.

In addition to his role helping schools become trauma-informed, Jim serves as trainer with the Children's Resilience Initiative. Most recently, Jim, together with Heather Forbes, published *The Trauma-Informed School*, an implementation guide for administrators and school personnel.
